Timing

The YITI World Series phase 2 kicks off on **15 September 2023 and will run until 30 November 2023**. With this document we establish the basic rules and remind everyone that "fair play" is expected just like in any other tournament or competition.

Scoring

The final score will be made up of 3 components:

- 1. 60% jury panel verdict
- 2. 20% video presentation engagement
- 3. 20% social buzz

Jury panel

We will disclose the full panel of jurors later to ensure full transparency and accountability. The jury will operate in the following framework:

- The jury will look at a broad range of criteria including:
 - Scientific and clinical rigor according to ITI principles
 - o Presentation style, storyline, and delivery
 - o Administrative parameters such as timekeeping, language, clarity of slides etc.
- A judge can never judge candidates from their own section.
- The panel is diverse in disciplines, genders, and geography.
- Lead judges are established ITI fellows who are supported by the YITI Global task force.
- Each presentation must be judged by 2 or more judges.

Video presentation engagement

All candidates invested a lot of time and effort into their presentations, which are at the heart of the contest. Therefore, engagement with their video presentations is key.

For this we will calculate an engagement score from various metrics that the YouTube platform provides. We DO NOT DISCLOSE the exact mechanics to avoid artificial engineering of metrics. Generally, the longer real, unique humans watch video presentations, the better for the score.

Social Buzz Score

An important aspect of the YITI World Series is also to create a social buzz around it. The more a candidate contributes to the buzz, the better. For this we created a framework that we call the "Social Buzz Score".

Starting from 20 September 2023, we will release a social media post on the channels of Young ITI for each individual candidate. The post will look something like the following:

At the end of the competition, we will tally several metrics of those social media posts into an overall score, the "Social Buzz Score". However, we do NOT DISCLOSE the inner workings of this. Generally, more real, and intense engagement with the posts is better.

Fair release schedule

To give everyone the same opportunity to create social buzz and video engagement we will calculate the score 60 days after the initial posting. The release schedule is planned as follows:

About a day after a candidate's post is released as per above, the respective buttons on their web page will link to the original social media posts.



Star rating

The star ratings on each contestant's web page play a minor role in the final score and are mainly a fun element for the audience to engage with.

Fairplay

We would like to remind everyone, that we always expect "fair play". This contest was created for us as a Young ITI community – it is hopefully a place and opportunity to network, exchange, come together and make new friends.

On that note, please also keep in mind that while the other contestants in your division are "competitors", they might as well become your team mates later. Remember that the 4 winners of each division will participate at the Grand Finale in Singapore as a team!

Divisions

After closing the submission period from the stage 1 local competitions we decided to shuffle the **composition of the divisions** somewhat. We did this to have an as even as possible distribution of all candidates across the divisions. Now each division contains 11-13 candidates. Since each division will produce 4 winners, the odds of winning are above 30% for each candidate.
